

Maurice Frederick Levy

General Practitioner (b 1925; q Durham 1947), died on 21st March 2017.

After completing his training Maurice (known as Fred) completed house jobs at the North Riding Infirmary in Middlesborough, before joining the Royal Army Medical Corps when he was posted to Egypt for 2 years. Following his return to the UK he undertook an assistantship before taking on a practice in Edge Hill, Liverpool, where he worked single-handedly for 30 years. He was the perfect example of an old-fashioned GP; he knew most of his patients personally, and he regarded them as his friends. His outstanding qualities were his conscientiousness, meticulous methods and attention to detail. He enjoyed 30 years of retirement with varied interests including art, music, rambling, gardening, natural and local history. He was still delivering meals-on-wheels in his nineties. He was known for his kindness, generosity and calm demeanour. He leaves his wife Joy; two children and five grandchildren.
